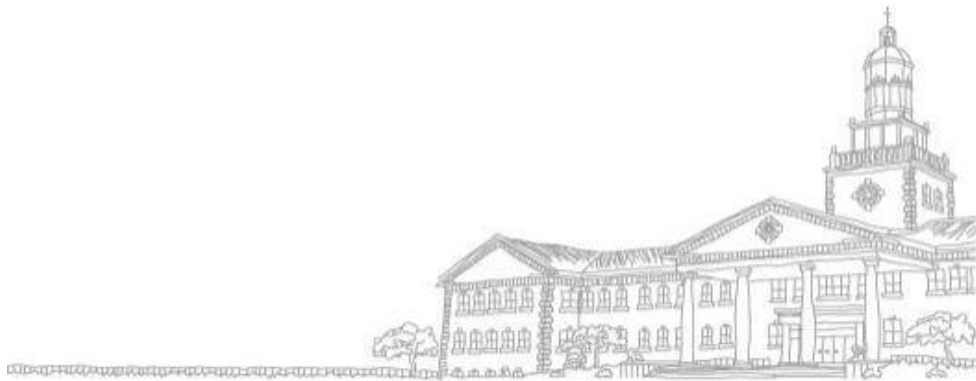

- Applicants must select and indicate their major field of study from the departments listed in the application form.
- Classes for students in Master's, Doctoral, and Integrated program are conducted jointly.
 - Every department opens courses based on the number of enrolled students from the previous semester (according to university regulations).
 - Courses are not offered separately by major; instead, they are established and managed at the department level.
- (Depending on course availability, you may be required to take classes from other majors within the department or other departments.)
- Some classes are offered jointly by the Department of English Language and Literature and the Department of English Education.
- Departments marked with * jointly operate both **Korean track** and **English track** program.

- For foreign freshmen in the English track program, admission is based on an evaluation of English proficiency, and students must complete more than 50% of their required credits through English-taught courses. Additionally, even if admitted to the English track program, students are required to take some courses taught in Korean.
- For departments participating in the BK21 program, graduate students who are selected for participation after admission receive a research scholarship (at least KRW 1,000,000 per month for Master's students, and KRW 1,600,000 per month for Doctoral students) and additional scholarship based on the academic performance.
- **The Integrated Master's and Doctoral program is designed for students to complete all the credits required for both degrees within four years and ultimately earn a doctoral degree. [If a student wishes to obtain only a Master's degree, they must meet the requirements for a Master's degree (credits, thesis, qualification exams, etc.) and withdraw from the Integrated program.]**
- For students entering the School of Medicine who have a non-medical background, the degree awarded upon graduation will be listed as Master of Science (M.S.) or Doctor of Philosophy (Ph.D.).
- **If the number of applicants for the Master's or Doctoral (or Integrated) program in a given department is fewer than three, admissions for that department may be canceled. In such cases, the application fee will be refunded.**
- Departments with fewer than five new students for two consecutive years may be subject to admission suspension.

- **Please note that once the application period has ended, you cannot cancel your application, and the application fee will not be refunded.** (Preliminary students in the Bachelor's-Master's Integrated Program are exempted from the application fee.)
- **Preliminary students in the Bachelor's-Master's Integrated Program are not eligible for the Integrated Master's Doctoral Program.**

A. Eligibility by Degree Program (Applicants from non-related fields are also eligible, but must complete 3 to 9 prerequisite credits after admission depending on the evaluation of their previous coursework.)

1. Master's Degree Program

- a. Those who have obtained or are expected to obtain a bachelor's degree from a domestic or foreign university.
- b. Those recognized by law as having an equivalent educational background.

※ **Bachelor's-Master's Integrated Program**

- Students must enter the graduate program immediately after completing the undergraduate program without taking a leave of absence, after being selected as a preliminary student for the integrated program while enrolled in the undergraduate program at our university.
- Those who are expected to obtain a Bachelor's degree and have completed 6 credits of graduate courses beyond the total number of credits required for undergraduate graduation.

2. Doctoral Degree Program

- a. Those who have obtained or are expected to obtain a Master's degree from a domestic or foreign university.
- b. Those recognized by law as having an equivalent educational background.

3. Integrated Master's-Doctoral Program

- a. Those who have obtained or are expected to obtain a Bachelor's degree from a domestic or foreign university.
- b. Those recognized by law as having an equivalent educational background.

B. Eligibility for International Students

1. Those who meet the eligibility for each degree program and fall under one of the following:
 - a. Foreigners whose parents are both non-Korean.
 - b. Overseas Koreans and foreigners who have completed all of their primary, secondary, and university education outside Korea.
 - c. North Korean defectors (submit a North Korean Defector Verification Certificate).
2. Those who meet language requirements for each program (excluding North Korean defectors).
 - a. **Korean Track:** Applicants must have achieved TOPIK Level 3 or higher, TOPIK IBT Level 3 or higher, **passed the Keimyung Korean Proficiency Test (KKPT)**, or

completed Level 2 or higher of the Keimyung University Korean Language Institute.

b. English Track

- (1) English proficiency test: TOEFL iBT 80, IELTS 5.5, or new TEPS 326 or higher.
- (2) Those whose native language is English or those who hold the nationality of a country where English is an official language, and who have submitted proof of nationality along with an undergraduate graduation certificate and academic transcript from local university.

c. Applicants who do not meet the requirements in (a) or (b), but are capable of studying in the respective language and meet the following requirements:

Recognized for language proficiency in the admission interview by the evaluators (no documents are required from the applicant)

- ※ **Even if admission is granted based on language proficiency in a particular language, students must meet the required language qualifications in order to graduate.**
- ※ Only valid scores within the past 2 years from the application deadline (after 4th May, 2024) will be accepted for Korean and English proficiency tests.

Admission Process

A. Document Review

1. Master's Degree Program, Integrated Master's-Doctoral Program: Bachelor's degree grades.
 - ※ For preliminary students in the Integrated Bachelor's-Master's Program: Completion (enrollment) of 6 credits in graduate courses and undergraduate graduation status.
2. Doctoral Degree Program: Master's degree grades.
3. Other criteria determined by department.

B. Interview Exam

1. Interview Evaluation Criteria: Knowledge of the major, aptitude, personality, presentation skills, etc.
 - a. Knowledge of the major,
 - b. aptitude for the major,
 - c. Passion and dedication to academic studies,Other criteria determined by the department.
 2. Applicants who miss the interview exam will be disqualified.
- ※ Preliminary students in the Integrated Bachelor's-Master's Program are exempt from the interview exam.

C. Practical Exam: (Applicable for Arts-Related Master’s Program)

1. Exam Subjects: Refer to exam subjects by major.
2. Applicants who miss the practical exam will be disqualified.

※ Preliminary students in the Integrated Bachelor’s-Master’s Program are exempt from the practical exam.

① Practical Exam Subjects

A. Department of Music: **All practical exams must be performed by memory.**

Selection Method

- A. Within the total quota, the number of admissions will be determined based on the number of applicants by field and department.
- B. Candidates will be selected through a comprehensive evaluation of the admission criteria.
- C. For departments with practical exams (Music, Art, Design, Media Art), candidates will be disqualified if their **practical exam score is below 60 points** (when converted to a 100-point scale).
- D. Candidates will be disqualified if their **average interview score is below 40 points** (when converted to a 100-point scale).
- E. If a candidate is absent from either the interview or practical exam, they will be disqualified.
- F. Admission evaluation results and scores will not be disclosed.
- G. In the event of a tie, the candidate with the higher score in the first round interview (practical exam) will be selected first, followed by those with higher scores in the document screening.
- H. Matters related to admission not specified in these guidelines will be decided by the Graduate School Operation Committee of our university.

A. Online application (Korean and Foreign Students)

1. Apply through Uway Apply at www.uwayapply.com: register, complete the application, print it, and submit it in person or by mail to the Graduate School Administration Office.
2. After payment of the application fee, modifications cannot be made. Proceed with payment only if there are no changes.
3. For application issues, contact Uway Apply at www.uwayapply.com or call 1588-8988 for system-related issues.
4. Print the admission application after inputting your details and submit it with required documents (please refer to the next section for the list).
5. Failure to submit required documents will result in disqualification.

B. Instructions for Filling Out the Application

1. Select the degree program (Master's, Doctorate, Integrated Master's-Doctorate), and select the admission type (General).
2. If specific majors are listed from the selected department, please be sure to select one specific major.
3. For 'Grades' section:
 - a. Master's program applicants enter their final undergraduate degree GPA, and Doctoral program applicants enter their final Master's degree GPA.
 - b. Provide percentage grade as "XX/100" based on cumulative GPA (for prospective graduates, please provide the average percentage grade for all completed semesters).
 - c. Percentage grade format: e.g., (93.5/100). If there are multiple transcripts due to transfer, only provide the grades from the final institution.
 - d. Do not include grades from before the transfer.
 - e. If the undergraduate program is divided into pre-course and main course, only provide the main course grades.
4. In case there are issues during the admission process, please make sure to provide a contactable phone number and email address.
5. After completing the online application, your application is finalized once the application form with an assigned registration number is printed (please make sure to check this).
6. Applicants who do not possess a Korean phone number may enter "010-0000-0000"

in the phone number field.

- b. Important Notes by Degree Acquiring Country

[Degree Acquired in Korea]

- Submit the **original** document indicating the degree number (returnable upon request after the selection process ends).

[Degree Acquired Overseas (excluding Korea and China)]

Step 1: Translation & Notarization

- Translate the degree into English or Korean (if necessary)
- Make sure the translation has the original language attached
- After translation, visit the notary and get the translation notarized

Step 2: Degree Confirmation

- All degrees acquired overseas must meet one of the following three conditions:

- ① Apostille
- ② Consular confirmation by the Korean Embassy in the applicant's country
- ③ Consular confirmation by the applicant's embassy in Korea

- Degrees submitted without one of the above conditions will not be accepted

[Degree Acquired in China]

- Submit both the original and notarized translated copy of the graduation and degree certificates.
- Submit the '(學位)認證報告' issued by the China Academic Degrees and

Graduate Education Development Center (www.cdgdc.edu.cn)

(It is also recommended to submit the '中國高等教育學歷查詢報' issued by the China Higher Education Student Information (<http://www.chsi.com.cn>)).

c. Important Notes for All Applicants

- Those who are admitted with a provisional graduation certificate **must submit the final graduation certificate before enrollment.**
- Students currently enrolled at another university cannot apply for admission to our university.
- Foreigners who have completed their studies at another university must submit a copy of their Foreigner Registration Card.

c. Applicants who do not meet the Korean or English proficiency requirements in (a) and (b), but are capable of studying in the respective language and meet the following requirements:

Recognized for language proficiency in the admission interview by the evaluators (no documents are required from the applicant; documents will be submitted by evaluators after the interview).

9. Financial Guarantee Documents (Bank Account Balance Certificate)

- **Must be issued within 30 days from the application date. However, if the balance certificate specifies a validity period, it will be accepted until the stated expiration date, but no more than six months from the issuance date.**

- **Required Bank Account Balance: Minimum KRW 16,000,000**

※ Students expected to graduate from our university or students who are enrolled (or expected to complete) in our language institute should submit a bank account balance certificate showing a balance of at least **KRW 8,000,000** (applies to registered foreigners continuing on to a graduate program at our university)

- **Account Holder:** The balance certificate must be issued by a domestic or international bank account under the name of the applicant, or the applicant's parents or siblings (only in cases where both parents are deceased).

※ **Financial Guarantee Documents will not be returned.**

- For those who have completed foreigner registration and are residing in Korea, only a personal balance certificate issued by a domestic bank is accepted. (If

necessary, proof of overseas remittance may also be required.)

※ **(Balance maintenance)**: The required balance must be maintained throughout the period of stay.

- If the certificate is issued based on short-term deposits/withdrawals, the balance may be re-verified after a time gap during review.

※ **If, as of the date of issuance of the Certificate of Admission, the submitted balance certificate is deemed to have expired, additional financial guarantee documents may be requested.**

Family Relationship Certificate and **Parent's ID**: Documents proving the relationship between the applicant and their parents, as well as the nationality of each parent. **If it is impossible to provide a document proving applicant and parent's relationship, documents proving the nationality of a legal guardian should be submitted.**

13. Notes

- All documents must be original. But in unavoidable cases*, notarized, apostilled, or consular-certified copies can be submitted (*e.g., when reissuing graduation certificate is impossible)
- All documents must be in Korean or English. If issued in another language, submit a notarized translation in English or Korean along with the original.
- All documents must have been issued within the last year.
- Issuing visa is the sole authority of the Korean Embassy (consulate), and admission to the university does not guarantee a visa. **Admission will be canceled if entry is not possible within 15 days from the start of the semester due to visa issuance restrictions.**
- Failure to submit required documents will result in disqualification.
- Interview Method: Onsite interviews (online interviews are only allowed for foreign applicants residing abroad).

How to Obtain an Apostille

▶ For students who have studied in countries that are members of the Apostille Convention.

For academic transcripts, graduation (expected) certificates, and other documents issued by foreign institutions, you must secure an apostille certificate from the

appropriate authority in the country where the institution is located (such as the foreign ministry) and submit it. Alternatively, you can obtain a "Certificate of Verification for Foreign Educational Institutions" or "Consular Verification" from the Korean embassy or consulate in that country and submit it.

► **For students who have studied in countries that are not members of the Apostille Convention:**

For certificates of enrollment, academic transcripts, and graduation (expected) certificates issued by foreign institutions, you must obtain a "Certificate of Verification for Foreign Educational Institutions" or "Consular Verification" from the Korean embassy or consulate in that country and submit it.

※ **Apostille Convention (Apostille Program, announced on July 14, 2007)**

The Apostille Convention is an agreement that removes the need for authentication of foreign public documents. Documents that have received an apostille from the foreign ministry of a member country are recognized as having the same validity as local public documents. - A. The submitted application and accompanying documents cannot be modified, altered, or canceled.
- B. After the application period closes, the application fee and submitted documents will not be returned.
 - However, if a department receives fewer than three applications for the master's or doctoral (integrated master's and doctoral) programs, the application may be canceled due to the current enrollment status of students in that department (or major). In such instances, the application fee will be refunded.
 - In principle, departments with fewer than five new students for two consecutive academic years, based on official university disclosure data, will have admissions suspended.
- C. Withdrawal of an admission application and requests for a refund of the application fee are only permitted during the application period.
- D. **When completing the online application form, please be careful, as you will not be able to modify the information entered after paying the application fee. Ensure that you complete and save your application before proceeding to payment. Once the payment is completed, print the necessary documents and submit them to the graduate school administration office.**
- E. On the day of the interview, you are required to bring your examination slip and an ID card.
- F. All documents must be submitted in original (however, for non-reissuable documents, a certified notarized copy can be accepted).
- G. Applying to multiple departments is not permitted.
- H. If the applicant does not meet the eligibility requirements or if any false information, forgery, alteration, or other fraudulent activities are discovered concerning the submitted documents (including those submitted by proxy), the admission will be revoked.
- I. Applicants who submit a certificate of expected graduation at the time of application must provide a graduation certificate prior to enrollment.
 - If you are unable to submit the document, you must contact the administration
